- I. <u>CALL MEETING TO ORDER</u> Director McKenney called the meeting to order at 1:34 p.m.
- II. <u>PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE</u> Director McKenney led the Pledge of Allegiance
- III. <u>ADMINISTRATION OF OATH OF OFFICE</u> Item not required for this meeting.
- IV. <u>ORAL COMMUNICATIONS</u> Mr. Ferons introduced Betty H. Ols0n, Ph.D. and Charles T. Gibson of the Santa Margarita Water District's (SMWD) Board of Directors. He noted they are considering serving as representatives from SMWD on SJBA Board.

## V. <u>CONSENT CALENDAR</u>

A. Consideration and Action on Minutes of Regular Meeting of June 11, 2013.

### **MOTION NO. 2013-14**

Thereafter, upon a motion duly made by Director Rayfield, seconded by Director Bunts, to approve the Consent Calendar (Item A – Approve the Minutes of Regular Meeting of June 11, 2013 as amended.) Motion passed 4-0.



## VI. <u>ACTION ITEMS</u>

A. Consideration and Action on Waiver of Conflicts of Interest re Refunding of San Juan Basin Authority Lease Revenue Bonds (Ground Water Recovery Project), Issue of 2002; Amendment to Operating Lease Agreement

Mr. Ferons offered that this is a request to renew the waiver of potential or actual conflicts of interest based upon Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauths's concurrent representation of the City of San Juan Capistrano (City) and the San Juan Basin Authority (SJBA) in connection with an amendment to the Operating Lease Agreement between the City and the SJBA.

Attorney Locklin explained this is the renewal of a prior waiver which acknowledges that Stradling Yocca Carlson & Rauth provide legal services to the SJBA as general counsel and special legal counsel to the City on a variety of legal matters.

### **MOTION NO. 2013-15**

Thereafter, upon a motion duly made by Director Rayfield, seconded by Director Kramer, to accept staff's recommendation and authorize the renewal of the waiver of conflicts of interest regarding the refunding of the San Juan Basin Authority Lease Revenue Bonds, Issue of 2002; Amendment to Operating Lease Agreement.) Motion passed 4-0.

B. Consideration and Action on Release of Draft San Juan Basin Groundwater Management and Facilities Plan for Public Review

Mr. Ferons noted a month's extension was worked into the schedule to allow member agencies personal and the SJBA directors to review the document. Comments have been received from member agencies. He commented that member agencies were contacted and the general consensus is there are no fatal flaws in the document. However, member agency comments have not been updated at this time. It is the plan to update the document once all comments have been received from the public. Staff's recommendation is to release the draft document for public review.

Director Rayfield commented he supports the release of the draft document for public review. He recommended that staff notify the Army Corp of Engineers of the availability of the document for review.

Mr. Ferons clarified other agencies; i.e. the Army Corp of Engineers, the California Department of Public Health, the local Regional Water Quality Review Board and the County of Orange will be sent letters of notification regarding the availability of the document for review.



A recommendation was made to add Fish and Game to the list.

Mr. Ferons noted the document will be posted on the SJBA website with hard copies for each member agency to distribute as appropriate. A recommendation was made for each member agency to add the SJBA as a link on their respective websites.

Director McKenney reiterated that the goal is to adopt the plan at the October 2013 SJBA Board meeting.

Director McKenney asked for comments from the public. There were no comments.

### **MOTION NO. 2013-16**

Thereafter, upon a motion duly made by Director Rayfield, seconded by Director Kramer, to accept staff's recommendation and authorize the release the draft San Juan Basin Groundwater Management and Facilities Plan for Public Review Motion passed 4-0.

C. Consideration and Action on Scope of Work for Peer Review of the San Juan Basin Groundwater Management and Facilities Plan prepared by Wildermuth Environmental and the Groundwater Modeling Report Prepared by Geoscience on behalf of Municipal Water District of Orange County

Mr. Ferons comment the intent of the scope of work is not to find fault with the document but to validate the basis for the assumptions. This task is to provide a high level review of the report from a technical perspective. Did the Authority look at everything it should have? Additionally, to focus on big issues that would fundamentally change the program.

Director Kramer noted he basically concurs with the scope of work.

Director Rayfield asked for clarification in the RFP on the following topics:

- Were any assumptions missed.
- Were there any unnecessary assumptions that skew the model results.
- Was the calibration of the model adequate.
- Was there sufficient assurance that the model is correct and can be the basis for future decisions, plans and actions.

Mr. Ferons noted that the Technical Advisory Committee will participate in the review of the RFP.

Director McKenney reiterated that the peer review process is not to pick apart the model, but to ensure that the model is being used appropriately. SJBA Meeting Minutes July 9, 2013

**SUBJECT:** Consideration and Action on First Amendment to Operating Lease Agreement by and between the City of San Juan Capistrano and San Juan Basin Authority relating to the \$31,555,000 San Juan Basin Authority Lease Revenue Bonds (Ground Water Recovery Project) Issue of 2002 ("2002 Bonds")

### **SUMMARY**

**Issue:** A technical error is contained in the Operating Lease Agreement for the San Juan Capistrano Ground Water Recovery Plant ("Ground Water Recovery Plant"), which incorrectly states that the termination date of that lease is December 1, 2035. The parties originally intended the Operating Lease Agreement to continue in effect until October 1, 2057, to terminate concurrently with the underlying Property Lease from the City of San Juan Capistrano ("City") to the Authority.

**Recommendation:** Approve the First Amendment to Operating Lease Agreement ("Amendment") in substantially the form submitted herewith.

**Fiscal Impact:** None. The Amendment will correct a technical error in the Operating Lease Agreement. Approval of the Amendment will conform the Operating Lease Agreement to the original intent of the parties.

**Related Actions:** The City intends to refund the 2002 Bonds. When this occurs, the Board of Directors will be asked to approve the refunding transaction.

#### DISCUSSION

On December 1, 2002, the Authority issued the above-referenced 2002 Bonds to finance the Groundwater Recovery Project. As part of that transaction, the Authority entered into a Property Lease dated as of December 1, 2002 with the City, pursuant to which the Authority leased the subject property ("Property") from the City. The Authority concurrently leased the Property to the Capistrano Valley Water District ("Water District") pursuant to a Lease Agreement and an Operating Lease Agreement, both dated as of December 1, 2002. The City is the successor in interest to the Water District under the Lease Agreement and the Operating Lease Agreement.

The City's lease payments under the Lease Agreement secure repayment of the 2002 Bonds. Pursuant to Section 4.2 thereof, the Lease Agreement terminates on December 1, 2035. The Operating Lease was intended to continue in effect past the termination date of the Lease Agreement to enable the City to continue to occupy and operate the Ground Water Recovery Plant at the Property after the expiration of the Lease Agreement and repayment of the 2002 Bonds, through the termination of the Property Lease on October 1, 2057.

Section 3.2 of the Operating Lease Agreement mistakenly provides that the Operating Lease Agreement terminates on December 1, 2035—the same termination date as is set forth in the Lease Agreement. To correct this error, staff recommends that the Board approve the attached Amendment, which would amend the termination date set forth in Section 3.2 of the Operating Lease to October 1, 2057. The proposed Amendment is consistent with the original intent of the parties and will enable the City to continue to occupy the Property and operate the Ground Water Recovery Plant throughout the remaining term of the Property Lease.
